In the first session of the Global Thinkers of the International Discussion Series, join us in a discussion with Professor P. K. Dutta from Jawaharlal Nehru University, to speak on the life and international thought of Rabindranath Tagore.

Tagore was the first Asian to win a Nobel Prize and is widely admired for his poetry, plays, and novels. He was also a revelatory political thinker, a universalist, humanist and internationalist. Tagore's visionary internationalism had a profound impact on the ideas of Mahatma Gandhi, and on Jawaharlal Nehru, the first and longest-serving Prime Minister of India.
