Biographical history: Mulligan, William E. (1918-1992)

Born 1918. Joined Aramco's Government relations department in 1946. William Mulligan was the Chairman of the Historians Committee at Aramco which produced the 'Report on the Visit of King 'Abdul 'Aziz ibn Sa'ud to the Arabian American Oil Company January 1947' for the 'King's Visit Committee'. Six copies of the report were prepared in 1947 and the original report 'was illustrated with appropriate photographs and contained a larger number of appendixes'. The report was reproduced in 1961 'principally as a memento for employees of the Company who participated in the events described.' William Mulligan retired from Aramco in 1978 and settled in New Boston, New Hampshire. Died 14 Dec 1992.

Scope and content: TS report by William Mulligan on the visit of King Abdul Aziz ibn Saud to ARAMCO (Arabian American Oil Company) in January 1947 which was reproduced in 1961 as a memento for Aramco employees and a two page TS 'Program of the reception for H.R.H. Sa'ud Ibn 'Abdul 'Aziz, the crown prince, at the Saudi Arab Airport' on 22 March 1948.
