served in Dongola Expedition 1896 with Indian contingent; Tirah Expedition 1897-1898;

in charge of Sirmur Imperial Service Sappers; passed Staff College in 1902; Staff Captain

Intelligence Department War Office in 1903; Assistant Secretary (Military) to Committee

of Imperial Defence in 1904; Secretary to the Colonial Deference Committee in 1906;

Governor and Commander-in-Chief, Mauritius 1911-1916; Trinidad and Tobago 1916-

1924; Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Southern Rhodesia 1923-1928; High

Commissioner and Commander-in-Chief Palestine 1928-1931.

Scope and content: File 1 consists of a proclamation of 1 September 1929 re. the Wailing

Wall riots. Copies in English, Arabic and Hebrew. File 2 consists of a letter from J.R.

Chancellor to Lord Stamfordham (27 May 1930) intended as a private letter to King

George V. The letter expresses Chancellor's views concerning restriction of Jewish

immigration, sales of Arab land, the attitude of both Jews and Arabs toward the mandate in

Palestine and his recommendation as to policy and course of action Britain should take in

the light of his assessment of the situation in Palestine.
