Biographical history: EVERETT, Sir William (1844-1908)

Born 20 April 1844, son of Revd. Thomas and Mrs. Gertrude Everett (née Walker). Educated Marlborough, (one term) 1856; Sandhurst. Entered army (26th Foot) 1864. Married Maria Georgina Calogeras, 1870 (2 daughters). Appointed Vice-Consul at Erzerum, 1878. Travelled to Rumelia with Col. Ardagh to map Russian frontier, 1879. Consul for Kurdistan, 1882-88. Reported on defences at Erzerum; British member of Turco-Russian Boundary Commission; famine relief work in Armenia, 1883. Attacked by intruder in his house at Erzerum and badly wounded, 1885. Resigned from Consular Service, 1888. Professor of Military Topography, Staff College, Camberley, 1888. KCMG, 1898. Died 9 August 1908.

Scope and content: Papers on his service as Military Consul at Erzerum 1879-85, including: diary, 1879-82; letters 1886-88 from consulates at Erzerum, Diyarbekir, etc. following his return to England; maps of the Ottoman Empire.

Access conditions: Open

Language of material: Mainly English, some French, Turkish and Arabic

Conditions governing reproduction: No restrictions on copying or quotation other than statutory regulations and preservation concerns

Custodial history: In the possession of Sir William Everett and his family

Immediate source of acquisition: Received on loan from his granddaughter, the Hon. Mrs. Irma Bailey, 1971, later bequeathed. Mrs. Bailey died 20 April 1988.
