Biographical history: HAY, Lieut-Colonel Sir (William) Rupert (1893-1962)

Born 16 December 1893, son of W.A.E. Hay and Louisa Hay (née Tucker). Educated Bradfield College; University College, Oxford. Served European War in Mesopotamia; entered Political Dept., Government of India, 1920; Political Agent, South Waziristan, 1924-28; Assistant Commissioner or Joint Deputy Commissioner, Mardan, 1928-31; Political Agent, Malakand, 1931-33; Counsellor, British Legation, Kabul, 1933; CIE 1934; Deputy Secretary to the Government of India, External Affairs Dept., 1936-40; Resident in Waziristan, 1940-41; Resident in the Persian Gulf, 1941-42; Revenue and Judicial Commissioner, Baluchistan, 1942-43; CSI 1943; Agent to the Governor-General, Resident and Chief Commissioner in Baluchistan, 1943-46; Political Resident in the Persian Gulf, 1946-53; KCIE 1947; KCMG 1952; retired, 1953. Member Dorset County Council, 1955-61. Married, 1925, Sybil Abram (d. June 1962): 3 sons, 2 daughters. Died 3 April 1962.

Access conditions: Open

Language of material: English; a small amount of Persian and possibly Urdu

Conditions governing reproduction: No restrictions on copying or quotation apart from statutory regulations and preservation concerns.

Custodial history: In the possession of Sir Rupert Hay and his family.

Immediate source of acquisition: Received from Fr. George Hay (son), March 1963, following Sir Rupert's agreement to leave the papers to the College.
