Biographical history:

Kessler, Leopold (1864-1944)

Born 4 February 1864, Tarnowitz, son of Jacob Kessler. Educated Realgymnasium; Mining Academy, Freiburg; Royal School of Mines, Berlin. Mining engineer, Rhodesia; 1896, general manager, mining operations, Transvaal; 1899, President, Transvaal Zionist Association; 1900, exploratory trip to Palestine; member of El Arish expedition, 1903; director and later chairman of the board of *The Jewish Chronicle*; on board of directors of Jewish National Fund, 1907-21. Married. Died 3 January 1944.

Goldsmid, Albert Edward Williamson (1846-1904)

Born 6 October 1846, Poona, son of Henry Goldsmid. Educated privately; Sandhurst. Entered Army, 1866, on General Staff; organised Baron de Hirsch's Colonies in the Argentine Republic, 1892-93; served in South African War 1899-1901; member of El Arish expedition, 1903; MVO 1903. President of the Maccabaean Society. Commandant of the Jewish Lads' Brigade. Married Ida Hendriks. Died 27 March 1904.
