#### Biographical history: Monroe, Elizabeth (1905-1986)

Born 16 January 1905, daughter of Canon Horace Monroe. Educated Putney High School; St. Anne's College, Oxford. Secretariat of League of Nations, Geneva, 1931; staff of Royal Institute of International Affairs, 1933; Rockefeller Travelling Fellowship, held in Middle East and French North Africa, 1936-1937; Ministry of Information, Director, Middle East Div., 1940; Diplomatic correspondent, *The Observer*, 1944; UK rep. on UN Sub-Commission for Prevention of Discrimination and Protection of Minorities, 1947-1952; staff of *The Economist*, 1945-1958; Fellow of St. Antony's College, Oxford, 1963-1973, then Emeritus Fellow; responsible, with Albert Hourani, for founding the Middle East Centre Archive at St. Antony's College in 1961; Hon. Fellow of St. Anne's College. Married, 1938, Humphrey Neame (died 1968). Died 10 March 1986.
