Joined Indian Police, 1901; King's Police Medal 1911; MVO 1912; CIE 1917; served France, Royal Flying Corps, 1918-19; Kt 1926; retired from Indian Police 1931; CSI 1931; Member of Council of India, 1932-36; KCIE 1937; advised Palestine Government on police organisation, 1937-38; Ministry of Food, 1942-46.

Kathleen Herbert. Died 6 April 1946.
