Biographical history: Grace Frances Popham Blyth, b. Barrackpore, India, Saturday, February 24th, 1872. Married, Wednesday, July 5th 1893, in Christ Church (L.J.S.) Jerusalem to Dr. Percy Charles Edward d'Erf Wheeler: b. December 14th, 1861, d. Worthing, November 28th, 1944, eldest son of Captain d'Erf Wheeler, Chief of Police, Mauritius, a military post. Both parents died while he was very young, and he and two younger brothers were cared for and educated by an aunt, Miss Jane d'Erf Wheeler. Succeeded Dr. Thomas Chaplin as Medical Officer in charge of the London Jews Society Mission Hospital, Jerusalem (possibly in 1886), then an old house in the centre of the City. The Hospital, outside the Walls, was built very largely from funds he raised by lectures etc. After the First World War, he went out to re-open Hospital, under the Mandatory Government. During the War, he went out to Egypt in the R.A.M.C. but when his two elder sons were killed, the War Office brought him home and he was M.O. in charge of the Military Convalescent Hospital at Shoreham 1917 till it closed. He was F.R.C.S. and had several other medical distinctions.

All three sons served in the 1914-18 War:

- Percival Francis Crummelin d'E. Wheeler, b. April 5th 1894, Wounded La Bessee, October 1914. Served in Kut. Attached R.F.C. and killed flying on duty July 24th, 1917.
- 2. Geoffrey Nowell Popham d'E. Wheeler, b. December 20th, 1896. Carried out alone a dangerous but completely successful reconnaissance of enemy lines, (the night before he was posted as "Missing" on the Somme), at Thiepval, September 26th, 1916.
