Biographical history: Shepherd, Sir Francis Michie (1892-1962)

Born 6 January 1893. Educated at Oakfield School, University College School and Grenoble University. Aug 1914 enlisted in the London Scottish regiment, Apr 1915 qualified for a commission in the Royal Artillery and joined the 7th Meerut Division, India Corps. Served in Merville, France. In Dec 1915 posted to Mesopotamia, and served in the attempt to relieve General Townshend at Kut. Also served in India and the Afghan campaign in 1919. In 1920 appointed to Consular Service and served in San Francisco, Buenos Ayres, Lima, Antwerp and from 1927 – 1932 in Hamburg. From 1932 served as Chargé d'Affairs at Port-au Prince, Haiti. During 1932 in charge of the British Legation at San Salvador. From 1935-1937 Minister Resident and Consult to the Republic of Haiti. Mar-May 1938 Acting Consul-General Barcelona. In 1938-1939 served as Consul at Dresden and Jul-Aug 1939 Acting Consul-General at Danzig. Oct 1939-Feb 1940 worked in Foreign Office. From 1940-1942 served as Counsellor of Legation and Consul-General at Reykjavik, Iceland and in 1942 at Leopoldville, Belgian Congo. In 1944-1947 served as British Political Representative in Finland and 1947-1949 as British Consul-General Netherlands East Indies. In 1950-1952 served as British Ambassador to Persia and 1952-1954 served as British Ambassador to Poland. Retired 1954. Awarded KBE 1948; OBE 1941; MBE 1932. Married Mrs Barbara Bayntun Fairbairn-Crawford in 1960. Died 15 May 1962.

Scope and content: Unpublished memoirs of Sir Francis Shepherd entitled 'Never Trouble Trouble' consisting of a TS hardbound photocopy including photographs and a bound incomplete MS version. The Memoir covers Sir Francis Shepherd's childhood and career, including an account of his wartime service in Mesopotamia in 1915 in which he took part in the military campaign to relieve General Townshend at Kut and also his service as British Ambassador to Persia in 1950-1952.

Conditions governing reproduction: No restrictions on copying or quotation other than statutory regulations and preservation concerns. For any commercial copying or quotation permission from the family is required.

Custodial history: In the possession of the Shepherd family. The memoir was written during Shepherd's retirement with the intention of publication, which was never realised. The exact dates of writing are not known; only that Shepherd began the work after retirement.
