Francis Mark Russell was born Leicester. Educated at Ratcliffe College and then Clare College, Cambridge as an engineering student. Joined Palestine Police on 29 May 1946. After basic training at Jenin he was assigned to the Palestine Mobile Force. Then applied and was accepted for work in the Criminal Investigation Department (C.I.D.) and was trained in photography and fingerprinting. He spent most of his time in the Lydda District C.I.D. based in Jaffa, but was transferred to C.I.D. Jerusalem from June to October 1947. Left Palestine 11 May 1948. Died 15 Mar 2007.
