Alex Lamond served in Oman initially with 2 Company, the Desert Regiment and then as Intelligence Officer from 1970-1972. Alex Lamond never married and died in a car accident in South Africa. Further details unknown.

**Scope and content:** Papers and photographs mainly relating to Alex Lamond's service in Oman between 1970-1972 including administrative papers on training of Desert Regiment soldiers and planning of various Desert Regiment operations. There is also some material relating to the visit of Major General M Janes MBE, Director Royal Artillery to the Sultan's Armed Forces (SAF) and the Oman Artillery, as well as a script of the BBC broadcast 'Guerillas in the Persian Gulf', including comments, and newspaper and magazine articles.
