**Scope and content:** Letter from Ernest Lomas to Latimer explaining that he had left Cairo

in Nov [1929] and had taken over as Consul General in Tunis in Jan [1930] and that he had

sent Latimer's letter back to the Consul General at Cairo to deal with. Lomas also explains

that the proper procedure 'if you are not sure of the identity of a Consular officer' was to

'always address it to his title, not name' otherwise the letter would be treated as a private

letter and forwarded to the named person, even if they had moved post.
