Born 5 March 1817, Paris, son of Henry Layard (Ceylon Civil Service) and Marianne Layard (née Austen). Educated privately, mainly in Italy. Entered solicitor's office of his uncle Henry Layard, 1833; left England for Ceylon, 1839, travelling overland with Edward Mitford; parted company with Mitford at Hamadan, August 1840; met Émil Botta who was excavating Nineveh; travelled in Asia Minor under the patronage of Stratford Canning, British Ambassador to Ottoman Empire; excavated Nineveh, Nimrud and Babylon; appointed to the British Embassy at Constantinople, 1849; Liberal MP for Aylesbury, 1852-1857; Undersecretary for Foreign Affairs, 1853; MP for Southwark, 1860; Undersecretary for Foreign Affairs, 1861-1866; Appointed Trustee of the National Gallery, 1866; Chief Commissioner of Works, 1868-69; British Minister at Madrid, 1869. Married, 1869, Mary, daughter of Sir John Guest. Died 5 July 1894.

Scope and content: Photocopies of 6 MS letters to Edward Mitford, 1841-1850, on his travels in Persia, Iraq and Turkey.
