Anwar Nusseibeh was born in 1913 in Jerusalem to a family who were guardians of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. Educated at the Government Arab College in Jerusalem and in 1929 was sent to Perse School at Cambridge in England and then studied law at Queens' College, Cambridge and was then called to the bar by Gray's Inn. In 1936 returned to Palestine to work as a Land Officer of Jerusalem and then as a magistrate in Nazareth and then Jaffa. In 1945 moved to London to serve as the head of the Arab Office. From 1947-1948 served as secretary to the Arab National Committee and was a leading organizer of the Arab defence of Jerusalem in 1948. From September – October 1948 served as Cabinet Secretary of the All-Palestine Government in Gaza. In 1949 returned to Jerusalem and gave his allegiance to the Jordanian Government. In 1951 elected as a Palestinian representative to the Jordanian Parliament, Chamber of Deputies. In September 1952 appointed to the Jordanian cabinet and he served as the Minister of Construction and Building, Minister of Defence, Minister of Interior and the Minister of Education. Appointed in 1961 as Governor of Jerusalem. Appointed in 1963 to the Jordanian Senate. From 1965-1967 served as the Jordanian Ambassador to the United Kingdom. Returned to Jerusalem shortly before the 1967 war. Served as Legal Council to UNRWA 1967-1979. Appointed as Executive

TS memoir 'Pattern of Disaster. Personal Notes on the Fall of Palestine' written by Anwar Nusseibeh and mainly covering events in 1947-1948. The memoir includes a discussion of the impact of the Arab rebellion, descriptions of bombings, looting, the creation of the Herold's Gate Committee in Jerusalem, attempts to arm, as well as description of fighting in 1947-1948. The first two pages are a photocopy and the rest of the volume is not the original, but a printed copy from a much later typed version of the memoir. It is not clear when this memoir was written, but Anwar Nusseibeh states in the memoir that 'my guiding test has been my erratic memory, and limited experience, in so far as I have only attempted to deal with topics of which I have first hand knowledge'.

Note: The memoir was written by 1974, as the Mufti of Jerusalem died in 1974 and is mentioned in the text as still being alive.
