Born 26 Mar 1903 in Albany, New York, son of Arthur Seldon and Mary Chamberlin

Carleton (née Wilson). Educated Oberlin College 1920-1924. In 1924 commissioned as a

missionary teacher for the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions of the

Congregational Church and sent to the Near East Mission in Turkey and Syria. Served as a

teacher at the American College in Tarsus, Turkey. In 1927 returned to the United States to

attend the Hartford Theological Seminary in Hartford, Connecticut and in 1930 graduated

with a Bachelor of Divinity degree. He was then ordained as a minister in the Congregational

Church. Continued to serve as a missionary in the Near East Mission but returned on

furlough in 1936 and in 1937 earned a Ph.D. in Ottoman history from the Hartford Seminary

College. In 1937, he then returned to Aleppo, Syria as the president of Aleppo College.

Served as the representative of the American Red Cross in North Syria (1941-1944), served

as the Selective Service Officer for the United States government in Aleppo (1942-1945)

and served as a member of the Aleppo mayor's committee for the Planning of Education

Advance (1946). In 1954 returned to the United States to serve as executive vice president

of the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions of the Congregational

Church. Following the merger of the Congregational Church with the Evangelical and

Reformed Church, creating the United Church of Christ, he served as the executive vice

president of the board from 1954-1970. Married Mary Dorrofield Cashmore in 1929, 3

daughters. Died 22 Aug 1983.
